

to Graylingwell. This could suggest a route through the university grounds which would open up a northern by-pass. Richmond Park Residents Association has objected and SRA will do so too.

h) **White House Farm development.** The application for the 750 homes on this site is currently delayed as the Highways Agency is awaiting more information from the developers on the impact traffic from the site may have on the A27 trunk road. RH attended a meeting at WSCC to discuss the implications of additional traffic, and the impact of it entering unclassified roads such as Sherborne Road. RH has spoken to Parklands Residents Association who has been undertaking traffic surveys, SRA will review their data prior to submitting our own comments. It is understood that a large amount of the Community Infrastructure Levies gained from the construction of new homes will go towards funding improvements to the A27. SRA felt that there were other areas such as doctor's surgeries, schools and other internal road network that also had a high priority. There were concerns that the levies from this site would not be able to fund a proper A27 solution whereas they would fund the more pressing local requirements.

i) **Trees.** RH said that as we have an excess of income over expenditure at present that some of this money could be used to fund additional street trees, and this was agreed to by all members present.

7. **Membership Secretary's Report**

There are 394 members, 330 paying by standing order, two in cash and two honorary members. There are 18 members who have yet to pay their subscriptions. VS gave a list of the locations of non-payers and members offered to help to remind them or collect subscriptions. AB asked whether the new houses in Chestnut Avenue had been canvassed for membership yet, but as the development is not fully occupied yet, this has not been done.

8. **Webmaster's Report**

MS reported that 8 pages of the website had been updated. 336 hits were received on the website in January, a small increase. Emails were sent out on the AGM and 58% of recipients opened and read them. 20 people followed the link to the newsletter 229 email addresses are in use.

9. **Planning Matters**

AB circulated a list of current planning applications. The application to fell a Sycamore tree with a TPO in place on land in Lavant Road bordering Summersdale Court. This application would allow the replacement of a telecommunication mast. AB to visit the site. An application for tree lopping in Hunters Rest shows the trees owned by Seward homes. However, there are claims that the trees indicated on the southern boundary to be lopped are privately owned and are covered by TPO's. AB to investigate. Concern was expressed concerning the University of Chichester's application to demolish a cottage and build offices. SRA has concerns on the grounds of no provision for parking.

10. **AGM of 12 February 2015**

Members felt that the evening was a success and a number of favourable comments were received from Members. It was agreed that both speakers were very interesting and well received. VS noted the insufficient chairs for all those attending. Apparently the numbers relate to complying with fire regulations. DM said that events in the Assembly Rooms in Chichester kept numbers within regulations by the issue of numbered tags at the door. Thanks were expressed to MQ and PB and their helpers for the refreshments. Suggestion for next years' speaker need to be made earlier.

11. **Updates from Representatives.**

a) **DM – Goodwood Liaison.** Reported that the next Goodwood Aerodrome Consultative Committee meeting would be on 1 April and the Motor Circuit Consultative Committee meeting on 23 April.

b) **SS – NCRA Update and Graylingwell.** CRAG no longer exists, and has been replaced with a group of Chichester Residents Associations to be called the Network of Chichester Residents Associations – NCRA. This body will pass information between themselves on relevant issues. There is to be a meeting on 30 March of NCRA, venue to be agreed. It is hoped that treasures, website managers, and the RA chairmen can attend. SS suggested the Parklands R/A website was visited by members to see how they operated. SS is to attend a NMP meeting on 3 March.

12. **Any Other Business.**

VS reported that the road verge near the turning into the Marchwood estate was badly damaged and muddy. The posts formerly on the edge were now missing. RH to action.
