# Summersdale Residents Association - Environment Report 29th June

#### **Grass cutting**

Both WSCC Highways and CDC Open Spaces have adopted a reduced cutting frequency for roadside verges and open spaces.

However Hyde who are responsible for Winterbourne have increased their grounds maintenance. And it is noticeable that many residents continue to cut and keep grass verges tidy outside their properties.

#### **Roadside trees**

On the 17th May an audit of trees was made in the neighbourhood by Chair/Vice Chair/ Laura Eccott Summersdale Tree Warden and myself.

A note was made of recently planted roadside trees and gaps where trees could be planted in the future.( See maps Jill Shaw)

Laura Eccott and Sara produced a guide to watering trees which asked residents to be active in watering trees close to where they lived. This leaflet has been posted to our website and on notice boards.

To date we have had positive responses from six residents living in Summersdale Rd, Highland Rd, Maplehurst Rd, The Avenue and Roman Fields

Planning Application 22/01109/TPA - Fell 7 Maple Trees - was considered as Chair had received a letter from a resident - considering the location of this clump of trees no comment would be made by the SRA.

The dry weather has continued and trees will be stressed which will cause further losses.

NB Prunus 45 Highland Road leaves lost - looking very sickly

Rowan Summersdale Road - struggling

Many of the whips planted in the four green areas under the Tree Planting Initiative by CDC in Summersdale, have died or are struggling, with the exception of Ferndale/ Maplehurst where Mike Steel's noble efforts with bucket and can has ensured a better result.
